


## 2010 commemorative issue

#### Ana Tsarev floral paintings

The Hanoi Ceramic Wall project is a major public art project that will transform the 6 kilometer cement boundary that runs along the Red River dike in Hanoi, into a mosaic mural of bright and vivid colours. The Wall will be officially unveiled in October 2010 as part of the celebrations to commemorate the Thang Long-Hanoi Centennial. As founder of the Hanoi Ceramic Wall Project, I invited the Croatian born artist Ana Tzarev to join other internationally acclaimed artists in creating a section of the Ceramic Wall.

Anna Tzarev has a special bond with Vietnam, having travelled often to the country. She based her Ceramic Wall design on her vivid floral paintings. She was intrigued when she heard that part of this wall bordered on the flower markets of Hanoi and decided to do a floral design because she felt that was something extremely positive and uplifting to celebrate both the millennium and the future of Hanoi. Flowers are the universal language of peace and joy. "It was important", she told me, "to commemorate the joy, hope and promise of a brighter future for this beautiful, historic city."

Anna Tzarev's works will be on view at the Fine Arts Museum in Hanoi from September 25th through October 4th, 2010 coinciding with the launch of the millennium celebrations. The Ana Tzarev floral paintings that formed the basis for her section of the Wall design will be the focus of the exhibition.
